Day 01	Home - Delhi	By Flight	
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Arrive Delhi, meet assist and transfer to hotel. Overnight at hotel.

Day 02	Delhi - Nawalgarh	By Road	255 KM/04 Hours
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In the morning after breakfast, half day city tour of Delhi.

Delhi: Sightseeing of India's capital and a major gateway to the country. We will start our tour by visiting Jama Masjid, the largest mosque in India, built by Shah Jahan. The construction was started in 1644 and was not completed until 1658; Red Fort, which was also built by Shah Jahan. This massive fort was built from 1638 to 1648; Chandni Chowk and Rajghat - the cremation site of Mahatma Gandhi. Witness the India Gate, the Presidents House & the Parliament. Visit Humayun's Tomb: built in mid 16th century this is an early example of Mughal architecture; Qutab Minar. The tour ends with a visit to Laxmi Narayan Temple (Birla Mandir).

Later in the afternoon drive to Nawalgarh, on arrival transfer to hotel. Overnight at hotel.

Day 03	Nawalgarh - Bikaner	By Bike	232 KM/06 Hours
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After early breakfast, start your first day motorbike journey to Bikaner. It is around 232 km from Nawalgarh and takes 6 hour rides. Overnight at hotel in Bikaner.

Day 04	Bikaner		
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After breakfast full day free for own activity in Bikaner. Overnight at hotel in Bikaner.

Bikaner: Someone said if ever beauty has bloomed in a desert, it has been at Bikaner. The colorful desert city of Rajasthan was founded by Rao Bika Ji during 1488 AD; Bikaner is located in North West part of Rajasthan in India. Rao Bikaji was a descendant of Jodha, the founder of Jodhpur. Bikaner was and important historic city in India and it was a major trade center as it stood on the ancient caravan route which linked central Asia and North India with the Gujarat seaports. Tourist Attractions: - Junagarh Fort & Museum, Camel Breeding Farm.

Day 05	Bikaner - Bhap	By Bike	132 KM/03 Hours
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After breakfast ride your bike to Bhap. Overnight stay in Bhap.

Day 06	Bhap - Jaisalmer	By Bike	199 KM/05 Hours
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After breakfast ride your bike to Jaisalmer, a beautiful city in Thar Desert. Overnight at hotel in Jaisalmer.

Day 07	Jaisalmer		
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After breakfast full day city tour of Jaisalmer.

Jaisalmer - evokes a vivid picture of sheer magic and brilliance of the desert. Legend has it that Rawal Jaisal laid the foundation of the city in 1156 A.D. After consulting a local hermit by the name of Eesul. Tricuta was the hill chosen and Jaisal abandoned his old fort at Lodurva to establish this new capital. Over the years the remote location of Jaisalmer kept it almost untouched by outside influences and even during the days of Raj, Jaisalmer was the last to sign the Instrument of Agreement with the British. In Medieval times, its prosperity was due to its location on the main trade route linking India to Egypt, Arabia, Persia, Africa and the West.

Tourist Attractions: - The Jaisalmer Fort, Tazia Tower, Gadsisar Lake, Jain Temples, Havelis. Overnight at hotel.

Day 08	Jaisalmer - Manvar	By Bike	175 KM/04 Hours
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After breakfast, ride your bike to Manavar, a beautiful resort situated in the heart of the sand dune of Rajasthan. Overnight in Manvar.

Day 09	Manvar - Jodhpur	By Bike	110 KM/03 Hours
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After breakfast, ride your bike to Jodhpur. Overnight at hotel in Jodhpur.

Jodhpur - Located at the edge of the Thar Desert, Jodhpur is a fascinating medieval city of Rajasthan. Founded by Rao Jodha, a Rajput king of valiant Rathore clan in 1459, Jodhpur is



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known for its amazing architectural splendor, vibrant culture, talented craftsmen, and lots of great shopping. The major tourist attractions in Jodhpur include its magnificent forts, palaces, cenotaphs, temples and gardens. Tourist Attractions: Mehrangarh Fort, Jaswant Thada.

Day 10	Jodhpur - Ranakpur	By Bike	157 KM/03 – 04 Hours

After breakfast ride your bike to Udaipur enroute visit Ranakpur.

Ranakpur - The main tourist attractions of Ranakpur are its famous temples. Situated approximately 90km from Udaipur, the Ranakpur temple complex is a must see. The main Chaumukha temple (Four-Faced Temple) is dedicated to Adinath, the first tirthankar. The two other Jain temples in the complex are dedicated to Neminath and Parasnath. There is also the Sun temple and the Amba Mata temple near the main complex.

On arrival at Udaipur, transfer to hotel. Overnight at hotel.

Day 11	Udaipur		
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After breakfast city tour of Udaipur.

Udaipur: One of the most romantic cities in Rajasthan, Udaipur is also known as the city of lakes. The marble palaces, beautifully laid out gardens and the lakes make Udaipur seem almost like a mirage. The City of Dawn, surrounded by the ancient Aravali Mountains and set on the edge of three lakes, is a brilliant kaleidoscope of narrow lanes flanked by bright stalls, gardens, lakes, palaces and temples. 'Udaipur', known as the lovely lakeside capital of Mewar.

Other attractions: - City Palace & Museum, Saheliyon-ki-Bari, Pratap Memorial, Pichhola Lake, Gulab Bagh. Overnight at hotel.

Day 12	Udaipur - Pushkar	By Bike	285 KM/06 Hours
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After breakfast ride your bike to Pushkar. Overnight at hotel in Pushkar.

Pushkar: Located just 11 km from Ajmer, Pushkar is a sacred little town in Rajasthan. Pushkar is famous for its scenic beauty and more than 400 temples. Pushkar has a number of exciting tourists' attractions including the famous **Pushkar Lake and Brahma Temple, Savitri Temple, Rangji or Ranganath Temple**. The annual **Pushkar Fair** held every year in Oct-November it's another major attraction for tourist.

Day 13	Pushkar - Jaipur	By Bike	149 KM/03 Hours
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After breakfast ride your bike to Jaipur. Overnight at Hotel in Jaipur.

Jaipur - The capital city of the state of Rajasthan also known as “Pink City” owes its name, its foundation and planning to the great warrior astronomer Maharaja Jai Singh II. The city of Jaipur has broad avenues excursion to Amber Fort. Elephant ride from the foothills of the Aravallis to the fort entrance. **Amber Fort:** At a distance of 11 kms from Jaipur, Amber was the ancient capital of Jaipur state.

Visit the **City Palace** which has museum having an extensive collection of art, carpets, enamel ware and weapons; **Jantar Mantar** - the observatory built by Maharaja Jai Singh in 1728 and the façade of Hawa Mahal.

Day 14	Jaipur - Fatehpur Sikri	By Bike	205 KM/04 Hours

After breakfast ride your bike to Agra. En-route you can visit Fatehpur Sikri,

Fatehpur Sikri - Built by Emperor Akbar in 1569, was the old capital of the Moghuls, which was abandoned after 15 years due to scarcity of water. The sloping levels of the city were connected into terraces which were utilized for various complexes such as Jami Masjid, Buland-Darwazah and tomb of Sheikh Salim Chishti; Khass Mahal, Shahi-Bazar, Mina-Bazar, the Panch-Mahal, Khwabgah, Diwan-i-Khass, Anup-Talao, Chaupar and Diwan-i-Am. The efficient system of drainage and water-supply adopted here suggest an extremely intelligent town-planning by the Mughal emperor.

On arrival in Agra, transfer to hotel. Overnight in Agra.

Day 15	Agra - Delhi	By Road	210 KM/04 Hour

Early morning visit Taj Mahal.

Taj Mahal Shah Jahan the great emperor and a great builder constructed Taj Mahal in the loving memory of his beloved wife Anjuman Bano Begum. Shah Jahan met this beautiful girl in his young age and later gets married with her. Taj Mahal completed in 1653 A.D. finished in by white marble, it is perhaps India most fascinating and beautiful monument. Not only is it recognized in just India but also all over the world. These perfectly symmetrical monuments took 22 years (1630-1652) of hard labor and 20,000 workers.

Return back to hotel for shower and breakfast.

After breakfast leave by private vehicle to Delhi, arrive Delhi and transfer to international airport to catch flight to go back home.
